► An Article from an Online Database (ex: SIRS, or EBSCO articles)

Last Name of Author, First Name. "Title of Article." Name of News/Mag—Underlined Volume
(Year of Publication): Page Numbers. Name of Database—Underlined. Name of Service.
Name of College, Name of Library, Library City, State abbreviated. Date source was
accessed <elec. Source >.

Example: Smith, Joan. "The Traumatizing Effects of Psoriasis." The Journal of Skin Lesions 64
(2004): 22-23. SIRS Researcher. SIRS Knowledge Source. Lackawanna
College, Seeley Memorial Library, Scranton, PA. 1 March 2004
<<http://sks.sirs.com/cgi-bin/>>.

► A Book with One Author

Last Name Author, First Name. Title of Book—Underlined. City of Publication:
Publishing Company, Year of Publication.

Example: Jones, John. Dermatitis and You. Itchigoomee: Knopf Inc., 2007.

► An Article in a Journal

Last Name Author, First Name. "Title of Article." Title of Periodical—Underlined.
Volume Number or Issue Number (Year of Publication): Page Numbers of Article.

Example: Rodriguez, Juan. "Ringworm Gets Under Your Skin." Skin Diseases Quarterly. 44
(2007): 1-22.

► An Article in a Daily Newspaper

Last Name Author, First Name. "Title of Article." Title of Newspaper—Underlined.
Date of Publication, Section followed by Page Number.

Example: Klumittonititz, Olga. "Scabies: Frightful Mites that Bite at Night." Pawtucket Times.
19 Sept. 1999, A19-A22.

► An Article in an Online Magazine

Last Name Author, First Name. "Title of Article." Title of Journal—Underlined.
Volume or Issue (Year of Publication): Page number(s), if given. Date You Accessed the
Source <Electronic Address>.

Example: Kloomp, Jonas. "Skin Rashes that Unite us: Folliculitis." The American Barber. 10
(2002): 3. 4 Jan 2003 <http://www.ambarber.com/story_id_12345>.

► A Website

Title of Website—Underlined. Name of editor, if any, preceded by "Ed." Date of publication or
most recent update. Name of any organization that sponsors the site. Date you
accessed the site <Electronic Address>.

Example: These Shingles Aren't on Your Roof. Ed. Konstatin Popopolous. 14 Aug. 1989.
American Shingles Association. 14 Aug. 2006 <<http://www.shingles.org>>.

Important Notes:

- Dates are written with the day first, then the month, followed by the year.
For example: 27 Feb 2008
- If there is more than one author, start with the author that is first listed in the text.
Then, put the other author's name(s), using his/her *first name first*. For example:
Smith, John and Judy Blue.
- For books with only an editor, cite the editor as you would cite an author, except
put a comma after the editor's last name followed by "Ed." to indicate the person is
the editor. For example: Brown, Jack. Ed.
- Consult the 6th edition of A Writer's Reference by Diana Hacker or the MLA
Handbook for further referencing.
